Family Day Care Excellence Awards

Just a quick mention about The Family Day Care Australia Excellence in Family Day Care Awards. These are the only national awards dedicated entirely to the family day care sector. The Excellence in Family Day Care Awards recognise the amazing work done by educators, coordinators and services in the family day care sector to deliver high quality early childhood education and care to children across Australia. Families, services and educators are invited to nominate, in their own words, what makes their educator, coordinator or approved service such an integral and special contributor to their life and to the lives of the children in care. Last year a large number of our educators were nominated and one of our Educators, Jess was a finalist in this process. We would love to see our educators and our service nominated again this year.

Unwell Children

Winter has arrived along with flu and cold infections/viruses. When children are unwell it can sometimes be a dilemma for parents when making the decision in relation to "Is my child well enough to be at family day care today?". If your child is unwell, consider the following questions:

"Will my child feel well enough to participate in the routines and experiences?"

"Will the educator have to spend time away from the other children to care for my unwell child?"

"Does the child have a fever?" If so, they should not go into care.

"Is there the potential for my child's infection to be passed on to the other children and/or carer?"

If a child is showing signs and symptoms of illness whilst in care, you will be contacted by your educator to collect your child/ren as soon as possible. If children go into care unwell, there is a risk of not only the other enrolled children becoming unwell but also the educator and the educator's own family. The educator may then have to close her service. Children tend to recover much more quickly when they are able to rest and be cared for in the comfort of their own home.

We do understand that parents/ guardians are often under pressure to be at work, however, to minimise the spread of infections please ensure you support your educator to keep a healthy environment for all.



It's Winter....Indoors or Out??

We all know the cold weather has hit but should this be a time for children to stay warm indoors or rug up and embrace the changing elements of nature and explore the wonder of the outdoors in winter? From the Admin Desk:

- We recently forwarded a letter advising you of the fee increase (.20c per hour) to the Administration Levy. Under Family Assistance Law if there is a change to fees or days and hours of care a new Enrolment Confirmation must be entered into. This is like the 'Contract of Care' under previous systems. After 1st July you will receive, via email, an enrolment confirmation for you to accept. It would be appreciated if you could do so promptly so we can then forward through to your MYGOV account. MYGOV will notify you of a change but you are not required to take any action within your account unless it is a new enrolment (ie your child has not used care for 8 weeks).
- In order for us to remain compliant with Family Assistance Law and Regulations all attendance records (timesheets) must be certified by the parent/guardian at the end of each week, either manually or electronically. Failure to do so could result in the Child Care Subsidy being revoked and full fees for care will then apply.
- If you have any queries regarding your Child Care Subsidy please do not hesitate to contact me.


